

Lake Underwood Nimrod Club Firearm Range Use Rules – October 10, 2017

The range was developed to provide a safe facility for members for target practice with rifles and side arms. No other area on the club property should be used for target practice.

Range Use

1. Range users are reminded to abide by the General Rules and Regulations of the Club regarding use of the property and facilities, re. P1, P2, P3, P4, and P4a.
2. Users must sign in at the range.
3. Users of the range do so at their own risk and assume all responsibilities for injuries to a person or property caused by or to him.
4. An individual under 16 years of age may not use the range unless accompanied by an adult.

Targets

5. Targets are only to be placed no more than 4 feet in front of the earthen backstop, centered in front of the backstop, and no more than 4 feet high. Use an appropriate shooting distance away from the back stop so that you are shooting at and into the back stop only.
6. Users must provide their own targets. Clay birds, glass, bricks, cinder blocks, rocks, indigenous wildlife and appliances are prohibited as targets.
7. Shoot only at targets. Please avoid shooting into frame work that has been built to hold targets.
8. Two shooting benches have been set up at 2 different distances. The front bench is offset; don't shoot into it if you are shooting from the back bench. Don't move the benches. If you want to shoot at a different distance than the benches provide, bring your own portable bench.
9. Deliberate shooting into trees will not be tolerated.
10. No moving targets. Airborne targets are prohibited.

Clean up

11. If you bring it with you, take it home with you. There are no receptacles provided for your trash.
12. Users are responsible for removing their targets, trash, brass, and live/unfired rounds.

Courtesy

13. Most members come to the lake for the serenity, peace, and quiet. Be respectful of others rights to enjoy their lake activities by limiting shooting times to reasonable periods, especially when others are in attendance at the lake. If noise complaints are registered a range use time limit may need to be imposed.

Safety

14. Users of the range are expected to know and follow general firearm safety rules. If you are unfamiliar, look them up, take a course, or ask for help before using the range.
