

# What can you do?

Preventing the spread of nuisance species doesn't start and end at the boat launch, it first happens with education and awareness. It happens on land and in water. Nuisance species include those invisible to the naked eye and those that are very large in size. Nuisance species are those that are capable of fundamentally changing an ecosystem indefinitely with irreversible negative consequences. With that in mind, it's helpful to know what to look for. Below, find information for recent observations and point maps of specific nuisance species in locations within a 50 mile radius of Lake Underwood. 
# Eurasian Watermilfoil




### Zebra Mussel




Locations - Multiple locations within the Susquehanna River mainstem between NY and PA

### Northern Snakehead

Locations – Snakehead are known to be moving north through the Delaware River watershed and have made it as far as Callicoon, NY. This movement north along the Delaware River corridor has occurred rapidly over the last 2-3 years.
